About 90% of the people who saw the post were not previous followers of NAS Facebook. In that sense it was successful. They also gained some new followers as a result of the article.)



So what can we expect next from the Gwrach Timeline Team, I hear you ask:

Since releasing the book Reflections of a Bygone Age I have had time to add a few articles to our website.

The first was about the finding of the Llyn Fawr Hoard, where I also contacted the Museum of Wales to ask permission to use some of the photographs of the articles found in the hoard, I also contacted the Rhondda Cynon Taff Libraries to again ask permission to use some of their photos of the work carried out in deepening the Llyn Fawr lake turning it into a reservoir for the Rhondda valley which led to the finding of the hoard in the lake.

The second article was writing by David Crick on his memories of working at the Venallt Colliery. This article created many comments on our history Facebook page and led to us gathering many names of the people who worked at the colliery.

The third article "Tales of the Craig Nedd Riverbank" was written by myself about my memories of growing up on the banks of the river and all the things we got up to.

A future article will be a Virtual Museum, which will hopefully capture all the Historical Artefacts to be found in the village. See below for an example of how it could look.


